Dear Church Family,

Happy 2024! The new year has finally begun. The transition between one year to the next is always my favorite part of the holidays. This idea was echoing in my mind as we held Isaiah 43:19 as our theme verse for Advent. Have you ever played with a dollhouse? As a child or as a caregiver, have you ever moved tiny figures from one space to another, going through the little, mundane motions that make up our days? Whether your dolls were Barbies in pageant regalia, detailed figures that sat at piano benches and washed tiny dishes, or GI Joes destined for joyous, repeated, fiery collisions, they mostly do the same thing each day. In some ways, we mostly play dollhouse, don't we? We waken and step, step, step to each new task, none of them particularly different than the day before. And that is not a bad thing. We flourish in routine; in it, we find fertile ground to grow disciplines and relationships and skills and hobbies, and even in our routine there are always variances large or small.

Until suddenly the dollhouse is sent careening. With the loss of a loved one or another major change—suddenly, everything falls apart, and we are left wondering where we are step-step-stepping to. Sometimes, when we let the full force of life hit us, we wonder if we have the strength to keep step-step-stepping on. What do we do? Sometimes, it looks easiest to try to just keep going as though nothing ever happened. It isn't easiest, though, is it? When the house is turned sideways and the dolls are tossed across the rug, it really isn't very easy or fun to keep pretending. It is okay until it isn't. And it is so hard, and no one seems to understand. And, also, God didn't ever mean for us to just keep pretending anyway.

We aren't made to hold it all inside. The grief has nowhere to go. Like a pressure cooker building steam, the pain has to escape, either through healthy ways or unhealthy ones. We can become angry and blaming, afraid and hopeless, depressed or anxious. We can become caught up in perfectionism or work or self-care or running or eating or a limitless number of good things that we can use to try to hide. And everyone who is suffering does, sometimes, to be honest. But we do not have to stay stuck. This is not the end of the road. It is the stage set for hope in God's rescue. And you are not alone—No one else's story is exactly like yours, but others know the sharp pain of suffering, too, and can walk with you through these shadows.

If you are suffering from the death of a loved one, you are invited to GriefShare. You don't have to go through your story alone. We have a safe, healthy place to learn to let off some of the pressure with others who will understand and encourage you, and it will make the step-step-stepping a little easier, a little stronger, a little more hopeful one step at a time. If you are finding yourself stuck with your pain about something else in life, please reach out. Life is complicated. Wounding happens. But you are not made to live this way forever. Sorrow may last through the night, but joy comes in the morning.
