The new year is on the way! In just a few short months we will come to that exciting time where we get to reboot, start over and begin new things. You may be wondering why I am talking about the new year in November. It is because I want to let you know about an exciting new sermon series and study we will be launching on Sunday January 8th, 2024! I am so excited, I have actually been wanting to write to you about this for months. Now that plans are in place and I can finally tell you...

Next year our church will be reading through the entire Bible together using the Bible Recap reading plan. The Bible Recap is a one-year, chronological reading of the Bible. Many people have been following this plan by Tara-Leigh Cobble for the past several years. I have found it an amazing way to read the Bible. The reading plan itself and the tools offered allow one to get a better understanding of God's Word. What I love about this Bible reading plan is that there are many ways to engage with the material. Below I want to share with you the different ways you will be able to join Central on our journey of reading the Bible. You will be hearing a lot of details about the program over the next couple months but I want to get this on your radar so you can start thinking and praying about how you will join in. If you have questions, please contact me, one of the pastors, our discipleship chair, Clay Cutten, or Carole Baker who serves as our Director of Connections. Any of us would love to share with you our vision for the church reading scripture together. One beautiful thing about this program is that anyone can participate without spending any money. All you need is a Bible and a copy of the reading plan. There are other resources you can purchase. We will be sharing with you in the coming months about those resources. Today I want to highlight how you can participate.

First of all, this will be our only sermon series for the year 2024. Each week the pastors will be preaching on a passage from the previous week's reading. Therefore, the first way to participate is to come to church and listen to a sermon about a passage from the previous week's readings. You will hear scriptures preached on that you may have never heard a sermon preached on before. You will also learn how all scripture points to Jesus. The pastors will highlight this beautiful element about the Bible each week. And if showing up each Sunday is what you can commit to, that is great!

The second way you can participate is to follow the reading plan. The plan will start on Monday, January 1, 2024, and lists scripture for you to read each day. We will have paper copies available, or you can follow along through digital options available on the website or the YouVersion Bible App. I read it through the YouVersion Bible app which gives me readings each day and reminders. We will give you more details about how to access the reading plan.

The third way you can participate is to read or watch the Daily Recap of the readings. This is one of the things that I find the most valuable. Tara-Leigh Cobble has a podcast (summaries of the podcast available in print) that gives a summary about the reading of the day with some key insights. She also asks you to look for what stood out to you in the reading. She calls it her "God Shot". Listening to her podcast this past year has led me to think about scripture readings in new ways that have led to new insights. We will make it easy for you to access the Daily Recap if you would like to make this a way you participate with us.

The fourth way you can participate is to join in a weekly discussion of the readings. Some Sunday school classes have committed to use this as their curriculum next year. Small groups may form as well to connect in person or through Zoom. There is a book with discussion questions to help guide the conversation. We will make all of the options to join a discussion group available to you if you would like to join in this way.

The fifth way you can participate is to buy a book from Bible Recap (we will have ways to order or purchase) that has questions to take you into a deeper personal study of the readings each week. This is for individuals who want a deep dive each week.

As you can see this reading plan of the Bible has all kinds of ways to participate. It is going to be an exciting year to see how God uses His Word to touch our lives. This is another way we are leaning into Jesus as a church. We have already begun our season of prayer and now we will lean into Jesus together through studying the Bible. Please pray about how you would like to join us in 2024. However God leads you to join in will be a blessing to your life.

The Power of Connectivity and Hospitality

Do you ever look around the church on Sunday morning, during the welcoming moment, to find someone new to welcome to the church? Well not too many months ago my wife and I were those new people visiting Central United Methodist Church.

The experience of being welcomed to this church brought Kelli and me back the next Sunday and the Sunday after that. We felt the warmth of a friendly church that made us eventually choose to be a part of Central United Methodist Church and make it our church home.

We have visitors join us each week looking for a place to worship or are just in town visiting. That first connection, walking into a new place, is vital to the impression that people experience. As they walk out the door after service, it is a primary catalyst as to whether they will walk through our doors again.

We often overlook the ministry of hospitality and how important it is to the vitality of the body of Christ. The New Testament has many examples of Christ's hospitable approach to people who were sometimes unwelcomed by his disciples and/or other religious leaders.

A good example of Jesus' welcoming attitude is found in John 4 where he encounters a Samaritan woman coming to a well to draw water where Jesus was resting. The woman, coming during the heat of the day by herself, is probably indicative of her feeling a bit isolated. Jesus demonstrates how important it is to have an attitude of connectivity and hospitality. His encounter with her leads her to a new revelation and insight of herself which makes her in turn eager to share that with others.

The welcome we give to new people coming through our doors represents, for them, an encounter not just with our church but also with Christ. We never know what challenging circumstances a person walking through the doors of the church is facing. Our friendliness and connection with them can be a vital step in their connection with our church and with Christ.

Each Sunday during our welcoming time make it a point to reach out to others who appear isolated or just seem to need a friendly outstretched hand. Kelli and I experienced that in a profound way which made us want to come back.

Though it may seem like a small ministry, the ministry of hospitality and connectivity is a powerful gift to the body of Christ. Let us remember to take full advantage of it each Sunday as we walk through the doors of Central United Methodist Church.
